First played for in1946/47 Continued to 2020














1st Annual Balance Sheet. Construction of courts in Meadow St

First official opening 25<sup>th</sup> September 1939



The wreckage of a sedan car which crashed on to the Mornington Tennis Club's court in Meadow street yesterday afternoon. The owner had left the car standing near the Mornington cable car terminus and as he walked away from the vehicle it began to move forward, missing an electric light post by a very small margin, and then running over the reserve toward the court. The car, after crashing down the bank bordering the tennis

courts, finally came to rest in this position.




