DATES 2023/2024

Competition Start on 9th October until first week of December. After the Christmas break, play will resume on Tuesday 7th February until 16 weeks of play have been completed. Some grades will go for longer given the amount of teams entered. Senior Prize Giving date TBC

DRAWS & SCORE SHEETS

- 1. Draw and results will be published on the Match Hub website
- 2. Score sheets are available at the NBTA's website

BALLS

It is the club's responsibility to provide interclub players with US Open Wilson balls. To prevent unnecessary wastage of unused balls, the home team (team 1 on the draw, regardless where the tie is held, home team is always team 1 shown on matchhub) will have to provide the balls for the tie.

ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS

- 1. Club captains can request dispensation for juniors under 14 years of age to be in club teams.
- 2. Teams made up of more than 2 juniors require the club captain to recommend the team make up as appropriate for senior interclub and must have an adult team manager to be the primary contact person for all communication with team and who is responsible for the team being on time and behaving as expected.

- 1. Juniors 14 years and over can play senior interclub without having to commit to the junior interclub competition. Must be 14 years old on or before the 31 December 2023.
- 2. Juniors 13 years and under can apply to the NBTA committee to play senior interclub. If accepted, the player will have to commit to junior interclub as well as the senior competition. Once approval has been given for a junior to play in senior interclub no further application is required for subsequent years.

JUNIORS TRANSITIONING TO SENIOR INTERCLUB FOR THE FIRST TIME

To get dispensation to play senior interclub, a junior must apply before entries close with the following:

- 1. The club captain's recommendation that the junior is ready both in terms of tennis ability and maturity to handle playing senior interclub with adults.
- 2. If accepted, the Junior must agree to abide by a code of conduct agreement before commencing play in the senior interclub for the season.

Juniors progressing from the junior interclub into the senior competition for the first time must spend one **full season** in DIV 2 Competition before joining any DIV 1 competition.

Guidelines for tennis etiquette are on the final page and all juniors are expected to read and adhere to them.

TEAM LISTS

- 1. The team list for all grades must include all core players for each team entered.
- 2. Players must be ranked in Match Hub order for the teams they play for.
- 3. The swapping of team orders can only occur if match hub ranking points change or player merit. e.g. a number 1 and number 2 player are to play in that position all season unless order changes. Players 3 & 4 can swap positions.
- 4. Players 3 and 4 in DIV 1 can play number 1 or 2 in DIV 2
- 5. In all team lists, one of the players must be named as team captain and that person's telephone number and email address must be included on the team list.
- 6. Reserves/Fill Ins: All team members must have a Match Hub player code prior to the game. Failure to do this means results can't be entered into Match Hub. To get a player code get in touch with your team captain.
- 7. If fill ins are used from other clubs this will count for Match Hub ranking points but not team points, unless it's a joint club team. You can use fill ins from other teams from the same club. If fill ins are used then they have to play in the position that they would normally play in. e.g., a number 1 from another team cannot fill in as a number 3. Number 1's can fill in for another team only as a number 1.
- 8. In championship or final playoff rounds, a fill in must be of equivalent or a lesser standard and have played a minimum of 3 ties for that team in the grading round to be eligible to play in final rounds. Players cannot be brought in for finals or play offs. In unforeseen circumstances, if a team is having difficulty fielding a team, they can apply to the NBTA for special dispensation.

- 9. Players that are members of 2 clubs cannot play, be a reserve or fill in for both clubs in the same competitions.
- 10. Women with a ranking of S2/D2 and above are eligible to enter in the men's competition. The expectation is that women continue to support the women's leagues. Requests are considered on a case-by-case basis.

RANKING ORDER

For all grades Match Hub must be the starting point for ranking and playing order.

- 1. Merit Club captains rank their team on "merit" (a combination of the player's ability, time spent on court recently, record against similar club players, age, experience, etc). The Club captain is entrusted with this role knowing her/his club members.
- 2. For DIV 1, club captains rank their teams based on Match Hub Rankings alone. If a team wishes to change this to a merit-based ranking they must have a valid reason for this change.

DEFAULTS

- 1. Defaulting without fielding a full team. It is the team captain's job to notify the opposing team, giving them a minimum of 3 hours' notice.
- 2. If a team cannot field a full team within 15 minutes after commencement time of the competition, then that team will have that match recorded as a default, and receive no team points. If players notify they're on their way, a common sense decision will prevail.
- 3. When a default occurs, the procedure will be team captains to enter the result in the dropdown window at the base of the results table along with an explanation written. At the end of the round the team that was available will receive the average points they received from the total of their games added to their final score. This can only be added by the regional coordinator at the end of the round or league.

ENTERING RESULTS

- 1. Agreed result to be entered by the winning team captain, within 48 hours of completion of matches. If not entered within 48 hours, it is up to the regional coordinator's discretion as to whether points will be allocated.
- 2. If it is a count back on matches and sets, then games will be counted. Tiebreaks are counted as 1 game, not the tie break point score.
- 3. In the case of a draw in points on the points table after the full league has been completed, the competition will be decided on the head-to-head result.

POINTS

Points shall be awarded in each contest as follows:

- 1. Each team shall receive one point for each match it wins. The team winning the greater number of matches shall receive 2 bonus points.
- 2. If the teams win an equal number of matches, the winning team is the one which won more sets or if sets are equal

more games and will be awarded the bonus points. If matches, sets and games are equal both teams will be awarded 1 bonus point.

Notes: In these calculations any match won by default will be:

- 1. If Player A does not take the court, Player B wins the match 6-0, 6-0. When a match in progress is defaulted by Player A, Player B receives all remaining sets and games.
- 2. A 3rd set super tiebreaker is counted as a set when a set count back is required. If sets are even and a count back of games is required then the super tiebreaker is counted as a game. This means the super tiebreaker could potentially have 2 values.

POSTPONEMENTS & CANCELLATION

- 1. Uncertain weather postponements by mutual agreement.
- 2. Teams are required to work together to arrange a suitable time to replay, if 2 reasonable suggestions are provided by one team and declined by the other then a default occurs.
- 3. Any outstanding contests must be completed within the relevant 8 week period. Rescheduling of the contest is to be agreed between the two team captains.
- 1. If the outstanding contest is not played within the relevant 8 week period, the tie will be considered as not played and no points will be added to the final scores.
- 2. In circumstances where this is not possible, contact the regional coordinator.

MATCH DISTRUPTIONS

If matches are disrupted to the point where play cannot continue (eg rain or lack of light) players shall agree the score and resume the match at the point where it was left when convenient only with the same players. If a different team shall play the rescheduled match, you should start the match from scratch.

WINNERS

The grade winner shall be the team which has accumulated the most points during the season. If two or more teams are equal on points at the end of the season a count back will be made to determine the winner, firstly of contests won and if these are equal of matches won and if these are equal of sets won and if these are equal of games won over the entire season. If points, contests, matches, sets and games are equal a play off shall take place.

CLUB CAPTAIN'S NOTES:

HOST FEES: Those clubs entering interclub teams in excess of that which can be hosted by the club on a home and away basis will pay an additional "host" fee. The fee will be calculated on an agreed basis of \$7.50/court for hosted home

matches. NBTA will inform clubs of the potential costs at the start of the season. Once play has been confirmed at the end of the season both clubs will be informed of the cost to allow the away club to reconcile payments with the host clubs.

TEAM FEES:

\$125 of which \$40 is the lighting contribution. Monday AM Women's do not pay light portion

SELF-UMPIRED RULES

Self-Umpired rules are available at NBTA's website

COMPLAINTS

1. Complaints or reports on breaches of these rules are to be made by Clubs (Club Captain, President or approved Interclub club contact person), in writing or by email, to the NBTA Regional Coordinator, within 7 days of the alleged breach. All complaints or reports must include club name, team name, grade and competition, opposing club name, date, players' full names and a clear description of the nature of the complaint. Where the complaint may affect the outcome of the contest, a copy of the result sheet must be attached.

TENNIS ETIQUETTE

Do

- Be honest with your calls. If unsure the ball must be called in.
- The ball must bounce before calling it in or out.
- Your opponent must be ready before serving.
- Call the score so your opponent can hear before the start of the next point if you are the server.
- Leave your racquet on the court if you have to leave for any reason and explain to your opponent why. Taking your racquet indicates you are abandoning the match.
- Have the decency to applaud good play by both yourselves and the opposition
- You have 20 seconds between the end of one point and the beginning of the next.
- You should be ready to serve or receive inside that time.
- You have a one minute break between the change of ends for a drink and rest

Do not

- Hit back serves if serve is obviously out.
- Walk behind a court when a point is in progress.
- Throw your racquet or swear this is not acceptable behavior.
- Intentionally heckle the opposition. All players have the right to feel comfortable on court.
