SEEDING	Seeding for all events will be at the discretion of the tournament organizers and the TP system but will generally be based on the latest available MatchHub Rankings prior to the draw being made.						
MATCH FORMAT	Singles <ul style="list-style-type: none">○ All grades (with the exception of the 8's and 10's and low divisions) will play the best of 2 sets. If one set all, a 10 point match tie breaker game to be played.○ The 8's & 10's will play the best of 2 short sets (to 4). If one set all, a 10 point match tie breaker game to be played.○ Lower graded divisions may also play the best of 2 short sets (to 4). If one set all, a 10 point match tie breaker game to be played.						



Doubles

- All doubles matches (except 8's & 10's) are to be the best of two tiebreak sets with "no ad" deuces and a conventional 7 point tiebreak at six games all. If sets are tied and a 10 point match tie break will be played. (Match Tie Break – 1st to 10 points with a margin of 2)
- The 8's & 10's will play best of two tiebreak 'short' sets with "no ad" deuces and a conventional 7 point tiebreak at 4 games all. If sets are tied and a 10 point match tie break will be played. (Match Tie Break – 1st to 10 points with a margin of 2).
- Lower graded divisions may also play best of two tiebreak 'short' sets with "no ad" deuces and a conventional 7 point tiebreak at 4 games all. If sets are tied and a 10 point match tie break will be played. (Match Tie Break – 1st to 10 points with a margin of 2).

PLEASE NOTE:

Tournament Officials have the right to alter the length of matches, play on another court, different surface or under lights if circumstances make it necessary.

NUMBER OF MATCHES	Players will get at least four matches if entered in both singles and doubles.
DRESS CODE	All players shall dress and present themselves in an appropriate manner for tennis. Please refer Players Code of Conduct for further clarification
WITHDRAWALS	<p>Withdrawals after the Monday 6th July 2020 will receive a refund less an administration fee on production of a medical certificate or due to bereavement. Tennis NZ Player Code of Conduct ruling will apply. If the tournament does not proceed due to inclement weather, a refund, less an administration fee, will be made.</p> <p>If a player withdraws or retires from a match due to illness or injury, one of the following will occur:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">i. withdraw from all remaining matches of the tournamentii. obtain a medical certificate that, to the satisfaction of the Referee, states the player was unable to play the match from which they withdrew/retired but is fit to continue playing subsequent matches. The cost of obtaining a medical certificate is the responsibility of the playeriii. a withdrawal received before the commencement of a match shall be subject to penalty as detailed below, unless a medical certificate is received. This includes any matches that are officially scheduled by the tournament <p>NOTE - Withdrawal from a tournament other than as described in 4. g. will result in a Code Violation being given, carrying 4 suspension points and resulting in a Grade Win penalty</p>
RULES	The tournament will be played in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of Tennis NZ, Rules of Tennis and Tennis NZ Player Code of Conduct. Players must be able to self umpire. Competitors must be prepared to adjudicate if called upon.
UMPIRING	All players aged 12 and older will be required to umpire some matches. All players should be prepared to be called on to umpire once their current match has been completed.
SPECTATORS	No person other than the match players, umpires and the referee may be on the courts, or converse with the players during play unless given permission by the referee. (<i>Videoing of matches is permitted only under the policy below</i>).
CATERING	A canteen will be provided on all days of the event. Cash only is accepted but an EFTPOS facility will be available.
