## PRESIDENTS REPORT 2020/21

Hutt Valley Tennis (HVT) experienced a burst of activity to launch the 2020-21 season. Unlike the rest of the world where for example Wimbledon was cancelled, and Auckland where lockdowns occurred, HVT was able to complete most summer tennis activities without disruption from the Covid-19 pandemic. All clubs with the assistance of Marc Paulik delivered promotional activities from the HVT Participation Strategy. Before the tennis season began, clubs invited busloads of children from local schools to fun filled Tennis Fests. This was followed with a Love Tennis weekend for children and their families to experience tennis in the club setting. Parent-Child Tournaments were also held in many clubs. This series of events was a team effort with many incredible volunteers gifting enthusiasm and applying their skills to create a buzz and raise awareness about the benefits of joining a tennis club.

The Mitchell Park Development aimed at providing four covered hard courts and earthquake strengthening of the building was advanced after the neighboring health hub indicated a need for extra land to provide specialist health services for the community. At a Special General Meeting on the 26<sup>th</sup> February 2021, clubs voted unanimously in favour of a proposal to relinquish two tennis courts and a car park in return for land on the southeast corner for a replacement court and the net proceeds from the sale of the land. The Hutt City Council facilitated the process providing a win for all parties including the Hutt Valley community. Gary Baird and Shane Jackson led discussions for HVT and were backed by the efforts of Grahame Boyd, Phil Fisher, and Brendon Smith. Shane Jackson single handedly worked with council officers on the detail which amounted to weeks or dare I say it months of volunteer effort.

Tennis NZ released a change agenda document which outlined governance and operational options for the future. After discussion with Tennis Central, HVT indicated it would like to partner with neighboring associations to form a service agreement with Tennis NZ for delivery of positive outcomes for tennis, in our region. HVT supported local alignment to create efficiencies, and opportunities to grow and develop tennis together, rather than going it alone.

The Participation Manager role did not continue after November when after several weeks of creating an application in consultation with clubs, HVT was unsuccessful in gaining funding. It is a goal this year to attain a grant to support increased participation in clubs, interclub and tournaments. The slightly smaller HVT Committee comprising Trevor Dine, Craig Eves, Shane Jackson, Dave Yorsten, Michelle Fisher, Gary Baird, Mark Hurly and Rachel Inglis have been steadfast and generous with their time. Included in this line up was Estelle Marshall who organised a friendly weekly Midweek league. Please remember to recognise and thank these people for their service and also our club volunteers, coaches, and sponsors. Whether we are celebrating a success or struggling with a challenge, it is heartening to be part of the convivial Hutt Valley Tennis community. The committee is excited about what the new year will bring, especially the new set of opportunities, triggered by the facilities development.

## MITCHELL PARK FACILITIES & SITE DEVELOPMENT REPORT

In the year of the COVID pandemic keeping our tennis facilities open and functioning required a significant effort by our staff and volunteers.

Aside from all the extra cleaning duties a lot of time was committed to maintaining the variations of COVID related signage in reaction to the ever changing alert levels. My sincere thanks to volunteers and the Mitchell Park staff for all their extra efforts and help to inform service personnel and patrons about our health and safety protocols so that the site could continue to operate.

Several of our competitions such as business leagues and winter tournaments were impacted by the pandemic and operating restrictions resulting in cancellations or events being postponed. I know this was very disappointing for many who had trained and targeted events but it was heartening to see the level of understanding shown by players and parents given the circumstances. I know we are all looking forward to the time when the weather is really only threat to tennis activities running.

## MITCHELL PARK DEVELOPMENT PROJECT UPDATE

The facility at Mitchell Park is definitely showing its age and a programme of maintenance works is desperately needed if playing activity and pavilion use is to continue at current levels. The deferred works have made operating the facilities a real challenge particularly at times when urgent maintenance issues arise requiring an immediate adjustment to daily priorities. While the reason for deferring such works is understood by all we can only hope the Mitchell Park development project gets underway very soon.

The latest update on the project is that Hutt City Councilors have cast their final vote in favour for the \$2.57m project to proceed. The project outcomes remain unchanged from last year and will be delivered in 2 stages:

- 1. Construction of an Indoor Court structure to fit 4 acrylic hardcourts
- 2. Strengthening and improved access to the Mitchell Park Pavilion to meet NBS

Final sign-off to proceed to the build phase now sits with members of the Mitchell Park Development Group and Council Officers, who are working through final design, build quotes, fundraising and the consenting process detail. Total Council financial contributions to the project from Council including the net sale proceeds from land revocation / sale process is estimated at \$1.7m.

Hutt Valley Tennis has been very fortunate over the years to benefit from the services of highly skilled volunteers and thankfully the calibre of volunteers who form the Mitchell Park Development Group feature some highly skilled professionals who we are lucky to have. The group includes: Gary Baird - Chair, Grahame Boyd – Pavilion Lead, Brendon Smith – Fundraising Lead, Phil Fisher – Financial Lead, Christian Lewis – Indoor Court Lead, myself – Council / Project Liaison, Council Representatives – Marcus Sherwood and Aaron Marsh.

From a playing perspective I would like to thank everyone who participated in any activity at Mitchell Park and your respect shown towards looking after the facilities.

A special mention must be made to our HVT Mitchell Park Business House tennis players who compete in our fun / competitive Wednesday and Thursday night doubles competition. The event provides a fantastic opportunity for everyone interested in tennis to compete in a fun and friendly environment.

## JUNIOR REPORT 2020 - 2021 SEASON

## **IUNIOR INTERCLUB PRE-CHRISTMAS 2019 & POST-CHRISTMAS 2020**

Thank you to the Junior Convenors of each Member Club. Each Convenor offered their knowledge to better the competition for another season. In addition, thank you to Craig Eaves. Craig sets up the draws each year, adding them to Configure Rankings. No mean feat and we are so very appreciative of the time and effort that goes into this. Also, a big thank you to Shane Jackson of Thump Sports, his understanding and expertise has been invaluable.

The number of teams entered for the season was down on last season by 7 teams 94 (2019/20=101) but down 16 teams over two seasons (2018/19=110), a continual downward trend.

During the previous Season we trialled combining boys and girls competitions. Each division comprised a mixture of boys only teams, girls only teams and mixed gender teams. The feedback, once the season was complete, was mostly positive. On review of the teams submitted for the 20/21pre Xmas competition, it was clear that we would again be unable to provide a fair or competitive competition for some teams due to the level of ability and the number of teams we could place in a Division, so agreed to continue the mixed gender competition format.

Pre-Christmas had 45 teams (2019/20=49) and Post-Christmas 47 teams (2018/19=52). There continues to be a number of Junior Boys and Junior Girls playing in the Hutt Valley Senior Interclub competition and a few representing their clubs in the Senior Premier Interclub.

## **CLUB REPORTS**



The club has had a successful year on a number of fronts; we were the first Hutt Valley club to open after Covid, we had a 24% membership boost following on from a successful Love Tennis campaign, and a successful Men's Premier 2 season sees us with Lower Hutt represented in both Premier 1 men's and women's competitions in the new season, for the first time in a number of years.

For our senior men's teams, we had six teams playing interclub by the end of the season – three in Premier grade and three in

Hutt Divisional. Four of the teams finished successfully in the top 2 of their grade. LHTC fielded two Premier Interclub women's teams in the women's competition. Post Christmas, the Ladies 1 team saw off the competition to be promoted back to Prem 1 for next season with the other team in Prem 2. LHTC won the pre Christmas women's Hutt Valley Div 1 pairs competition, and post Christmas we had a team in the Hutt Div 1 pairs and also entered a team who won Tecnifibre Interclub Div 3. We had several new players join interclub teams for the first time and players stepping up to a higher level of competition (including juniors), which is great for the future of interclub at Lower Hutt.

The number of Junior members continues to increase with LHTC having seven junior teams playing Interclub. A special mention goes to Aryav Bhawan who was named Tennis Central Rookie of the Year. Our Regional Boys Div 1 team won their grade pre Christmas which was a step up on their second place last year. The Sunday Juniors (pre-interclub levels) also increased its membership and saw all ten courts being played on at times. Lower Hutt Junior tennis has had a great year, including organising their teams for junior interclub competitions, some of our juniors being invited to representative tournaments, Parent-Child doubles tournament, Junior Club Champs and the Love Tennis Open Day.

In addition to our regular leagues where attendance numbers have blossomed this year, our Beginners Meet Up for adults continued into its second year. ## TREASURERS REPORT

This is my first year being Treasurer for HVT, and second-year on the Committee. It's a really exciting time for tennis in the Hutt Valley right now, and really rewarding having some input into strategy and the opportunities ahead.

I would like to thank my fellow Committee members for their consideration and questions about the finances along the way and in particular mention Jan Milne and Shane Jackson who have been incredibly generous with their time in the transition period between Brenda Hood (former Treasurer) and myself. Thanks also to Brenda for answering the odd question when I called upon her.

## FINANCIAL RESULTS FOR THE 2020/21 YEAR

The Association reported an operating deficit of (\$7,500) (\$23,080 deficit prior year). This was \$12,485 ahead of budget. The main driver of this was COVID-19 relief grants, and reduced repairs and maintenance costs, as we looked to ensure that we were only spending what was necessary for the build-up to our redevelopment program.

We were fortunate in receiving COVID-19 relief grants, which enabled us to absorb some of the impacts of not being able to run certain competitions and open the bar during movements up and down the various COVID-19 levels, while still having to pay various fixed costs.

## **BUDGET FOR THE 2020/21 YEAR**

The budget for 2021/22 year was put together with some difficulty, as we as a Committee face some uncertainty in terms of the timing of the Mitchell Park Redevelopment. Once this project begins, there will be various impacts on the facility at different times, such as lack of access to courts and other parts of the complex. We are hopeful that we will be able to work around these impacts and have worked closely with Shane Jackson to ensure that the budget is as realistic as possible.

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# Independent auditor's report

#### To the Committee Members of Hutt Valley Tennis Incorporated

#### **Qualified Opinion**

We have audited the special purpose financial statements of Hutt Valley Tennis Incorporated on pages 4 to 7 and 9 to 13, which comprise the balance sheet as at 30 April 2021 and the statement of profit or loss, and statement of changes in equity for the year then ended, and notes to the special purpose financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section of our report, the accompanying financial statements of Hutt Valley Tennis Incorporated for the year ended 30 April 2021 are prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the financial reporting provisions of the Special Purpose Financial Reporting Framework for use by for-profit entities issued by Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand.

#### **Basis for Qualified Opinion**

Hutt Valley Tennis Incorporated's reported income includes cash revenue from activity income.

In common with similar organisations, control over such cash revenue prior to being recorded is limited and there are no practical audit procedures to determine the effect of this limited control.

We were unable to attend the stocktake at balance date. We were therefore unable to satisfy ourselves by alternative means concerning the stock (bar) held at 31 March 2021. As a result of these matters, we were unable to determine whether any adjustments might have been found to be necessary in respect of recorded or unrecorded stock on hand and the elements making up the statement of financial performance (cost of sales) and statement of movements in equity.

In these respects alone, we have not obtained all the information and explanations that we have required.

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand) (ISAs (NZ)). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the special purpose financial statements section of our report.

We are independent of Hutt Valley Tennis Incorporated in accordance with Professional and Ethical Standard 1 International Code of Ethics for Assurance Practitioners (including International Independence Standards) (New Zealand) issued by the New Zealand Auditing and Assurance Standards Board, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Other than our capacity as auditor we have no relationship with, or interests in, Hutt Valley Tennis Incorporated.

## Emphasis of Matter – Basis of Accounting

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to the basis of preparation, which describes the basis of accounting. The special purpose financial statements are prepared for the members and funders of Hutt Valley Tennis Incorporated. As a result, the special purpose financial statements may not be suitable for another purpose.



#### Other information

The Committee Members are responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the statement of service performance, but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of audit opinion or assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Responsibilities of the Committee Members for the special purpose financial statements

The committee members are responsible on behalf of Hutt Valley Tennis Incorporated for the preparation of these special purpose financial statements in accordance with the *Special Purpose Financial Reporting Framework for use by for-profit entities* issued by Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand and for such internal control the committee members determine is necessary to enable the preparation of special purpose financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, the committee members are responsible on behalf of Hutt Valley Tennis Incorporated for assessing Hutt Valley Tennis Incorporated's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the committee members either intend to liquidate Hutt Valley Tennis Incorporated or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

#### HUTT VALLEY TENNIS INCORPORATED STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES FOR THE 12 MONTH PERIOD ENDED 30 APRIL 2021

#### Reporting Entity

These are the financial statements of Hutt Valley Tennis Incorporated ('HVT'). HVT is an Incorporated Society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with "A Special Purpose Financial Reporting for use by For-Profit Entities" (The Framework) published by Chartered Accountants Australia New Zealand and is considered by the Committee to be an appropriate framework on which to prepare the financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2021.

These special purpose financial statements have been prepared for our members and funders.

The financial statements are prepared under the assumption that HVT will continue to operate as a going concern in the foreseeable future.

#### Measurement Rase

The HVT uses historical cost basis for the measurement and reporting of its results and financial position, except for investments, which are measured at net market value. The financial statements are presented in New Zealand dollards (NZS).

#### Specific Accounting Policies

The following specific accounting policies that materially affect the measurement of financial performance and financial position have been applied:

- Grants Revenue is included in operating revenue when earned. If particular conditions are attached (a) to a grant that would require it to be repaid if these conditions were not met, then the income received is recorded as a liability under Deferred Grants to the extent that the conditions are not yet met as at the year end.
- Fixed Assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation. (b)

Fixed assets are depreciated over their economic useful life using the following straight line depreciation rates:

10 years Court Lights 10 years Office Equipment 5 years Heat Pump 5 years String Machine 5 years Pavilion 20 years 5 years Furniture and Fittings Seating Petangue Piste 5 years

- Stock has been valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value. Cost is determined using the first-in, first out (c)(FIFO) method.
- (d) Debtors - are stated at estimated realisable value. Bad debts are written off in the year in which they are identified.
- (e) Investments - shares held in listed companies are recorded at net market value as at the reporting date. The Net Market Value is calculated using the closing share price as published by the New Zealand Stock Exchange. The resulting increase or decrease in value of shares held is recognised in the Statement of Financial Performance as sundry income.

- (f) Goods and Services Tax (GST) the Statement of Financial Performance has been prepared so that all components of revenue and expenses are stated exclusive of GST. All items in the Statement of Financial Position are stated net of GST with the exception of Debtors and Creditors, which include GST where invoiced.
- Income Tax HVT is approved as an amateur sports promoter and is therefore exempt from Income Tax under Section CW46 of the Income Tax Act 2007.
- (h) Comparative Figures Comparative figures are for the 12 months ended 30th April 2020.
- (i) Changes in accounting policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies during the year.

- Affiliation fees in 2019/20 decrease by the Tennis NZ subsidy amount granted by clubs
- Rationale to pass on Tennis NZ subsidy intended for clubs and not increase fees due to effect of Covid-19
- Development Levy fee of \$10 per senior and \$5 per 'junior and under 12' member to raise approximately \$7K for the court and building development.
   Rationale: The HVT Committee propose to retain the Development Levy introduced two years ago. This is part of a mixed method strategy to pay for the court development and a code compliant building. The HVT Management Committee has limited capacity to carry out fundraising activities of the magnitude required to fund this development. We ask that \$7,500 be raised via the continuance of a Development Levy. Other activities to raise funds will include sponsorship, grant applications and other fundraising opportunities.
