PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2011-2012 SEASON

Firstly, I can report that Kilbirnie Tennis Club is still in good heart, despite a small drop in membership. This appears to be a common issue with many other clubs around Wellington. We have always had an enthusiastic core club membership. Our ongoing challenge remains to find ways to fire up this kind of enthusiasm in other club members and also draw in new members.

One area of real enthusiasm in the club is the midweek club. In the last few years, Diana Spice has grabbed this club by the scruff of the neck and turned it into a welloiled machine. For this, and her previous service to the club, she has been awarded a well-deserved life membership.

Looking at our facilities, I think everyone will agree that the new top courts have been a big success and are a pleasure to play on. They have really enhanced the feel of the top courts. It would be fair to say that, for various reasons, the lower courts have progressed more slowly than we all would have liked. We are hoping to have the final Synpave hard surface applied early in the new summer season. As an aside, despite their motley appearance, they are currently the smoothest asphalt court you could ever play on! Once this work is complete we will have five top-class courts, up with the best of any other club in Wellington. Looking forward, I see the clubrooms are looking a little tired and in need of a spruce-up. And I know there are many club members who would like to revisit the subject of lights!

To finish off, I think this coming season is one where we really need to drive for new members, leveraging off our new courts. Again, I would remind everyone that your committee are all volunteers and welcome any help or ideas. Do you have ideas on how we can improve the club? Do you have things that bug you about the club? Let someone on the incoming committee know. Even better, would you consider serving a year or two on the committee? It is not hard work or time consuming, and at times can provide a real feeling of achievement.

We now eagerly await the start of the 2012/13 season and some warmer weather to get everybody geared up for the summer season.
