

WELLINGTON TENNIS ASKS YOU TO BE A SUPPORTER.

The Wellington Renouf Tennis Centre is the home of tennis for the lower North Island. It is a fantastic facility, with 6 indoor and 12 outdoor tennis courts, used by more than 4,000 people each and every year.

THE CENTRE IS HOME TO:

- a multitude of regional, national and international tennis tournaments each year, including the Wellington Open - New Zealand Championships and the Fed Cup (Feb 2020);
- competitive and social competitions for the local tennis community;
- player development and coaching, including Tennis NZ's regional performance programme for the next generation of world-ranked players; and
- · casual participants having a hit.

The Centre is a place for fun, friendship and success through the sport of tennis.

The Centre has been recognised by entities such as the Wellington City Council, Sport NZ, Sport Wellington & Tennis NZ as being of strategic significance to the sport of tennis nationally.

The Centre also accommodates other sports, with Karate & Futsal regular users.

The All Blacks hold their game day training prior to a Wellington test match on the indoor courts.

The majority of the current Centre infrastructure was built in the 1980s. Still one of the best tennis centres in the country, it is showing signs of age.

An independent condition assessment completed by Opus (WSP) in 2016 identified \$6.8 million of capital maintenance required over the next 15 years. Over half of that expense is in the next five years.

KEY ELEMENTS OF THE RECOMMENDED WORKS INCLUDE:

- replacing the roof above the main four indoor courts
- converting the lighting on the indoor courts to LED
- upgrading the changing rooms and bathrooms
- electrical maintenance, incl: works specific to heating and ventilation
- restoring outdoor stands
- re-surfacing of tennis courts

Wellington Tennis Inc., as owner of the Centre, and Tennis Central Region Inc. as the primary user of the Centre, are committed to completing these works.

The goal is to ensure that future generations can use the Centre and have similar experiences to those that have used the current facilities for the past 40 years.

With this goal in mind Tennis Central has committed \$600,000 to the required works over the next 5 years.

The Wellington City Council has agreed to provide \$1 million funding on the basis of this contribution being matched \$ for \$ from the tennis community by 2023.

Various gaming trusts have indicated commitment to support the project, with notable contributions already received from the NZ Community Trust and the Racing Industry Transition Agency.

Whether it is financial support from a business or from you personally, every contribution counts.
